Within an hour of the start of the Camp Fire, NVCF established an emergency response and long-term recovery fund to collect local, national, and international donations. We immediately reached out to hundreds of our local nonprofit partners to understand their role and financial needs in directly providing services to people displaced by the Camp Fire. EMERGENCY RESPONSE



- **Granting** money to vetted local nonprofit partners providing direct services to people displaced by the Camp Fire.
- **Funding** the purchase of gift and cash cards to people displaced by the Camp Fire.
- **Determining** immediate and ongoing needs of organizations and agencies providing direct services to people displaced by the Camp Fire.
- As of December 10, 2018, we have granted **nearly a million dollars** for direct services to people displaced by the Camp Fire.
- North Valley Community Foundation has a **1%** administrative fee.

LONG-TERM RECOVERY



- Build a framework and funding for local, collaborative **long-term recovery** that includes:
 - Housing
 - Education
 - Children/ Youth Services
 - Health & Wellness
 - Community & Economic Development
 - Business Recovery
- Establish a Camp Fire **recovery network** of individuals, organizations and agencies working on county-wide recovery efforts.
- Determine and **address gaps** left by local, state and federal agencies and create a roadmap to address unmet needs.

CONNECTION



- Financial Resources—**Raise money** for the emergency response and long-term recovery efforts.
- Connect donors and volunteers to local **vetted nonprofits** serving people displaced by the Camp Fire.
- Connecting in-kind donations to local vetted nonprofits **servicing people** displaced by the Camp Fire.
