The North Valley Community Foundation released more grants today to groups that are providing relief to individuals affected by the Camp Fire.

That brings the total to \$2,270,765.30 in Camp Fire Relief Fund grants distributed so far. (This is separate from the Butte Strong Fund, which has also distributed millions in grants.)

This week's grants include the following:

Passages, CSU Chico Research Foundation (\$25,000): To help older adults affected by the Camp Fire secure medical equipment and home items.

Camp Fire Long Term Recovery Group (\$5,000): Requested assistance for operational support.

Pedro Gtp Relief (\$25,000): To continue the operation of their relief warehouse in Redding that has been serving those affected by the Camp Fire.

Little Chico Creek Elementary School (\$6,800): To make the A.S.S.I.S.T Team Coaches program, which offers a play-based curriculum that teaches social-emotional skills through playground games and social interaction, available to students.

Achieve Charter School of Paradise (\$25,000): To send sixth- and eighth-grade classes on their annual field trip free of charge and with adequate gear.
