The North Valley Community Foundation announced today it is granting nearly \$200,000 to several groups that are providing relief in the aftermath of the Camp Fire.

That brings the total to \$1,657,916 in Camp Fire relief funds distributed so far.

Included in the newest \$178,394.03 in grants is \$11,432 to a group hosting a nondenominational "celebration of life" service for people who died in the Camp Fire. That will be held Feb. 8 in Paradise.

The other grants included:

From the Ground Up Farms (\$25,000): To provide gift cards and cash cards to those affected by the Camp Fire.

Yankee Hill Historical Society (\$3,712): To provide a portable toilet and handwashing station for a facility that would be used for community meetings in Yankee Hill/Concow.

Sierra View Elementary School (\$3,750): To offset costs related to bringing in and providing supplies for new and existing students who were displaced by the fire.

Town of Paradise (\$24,500): For a roadway condition assessment.

Butte County Fire Safe Council (\$15,000): To develop and publish the California Native Plant Society Wildfire Recovery Guide to help with wildfire prevention.

Throwing Starfish Foundation (\$20,000): For direct assistance to those affected by the Camp Fire.

Yankee Hill Fire Safe Council (\$25,000): For direct assistance to those affected by the Camp Fire.

RV4Campfirefamily (\$25,000): To purchase and repair RVs for the RV matching program to benefit those affected by the Camp Fire.

Chico Community Scholarship Association (\$25,000): For scholarships to graduating seniors who were affected by the Camp Fire.

NVCF also granted \$965,000 to Butte County schools made possible by a donation from Ken Grossman and Katie Gonser.
